

From the Study Window

In his book <u>The Seventh Sense</u> Joshua Cooper Ramo argues that we are entering a profoundly new era of connected crises that are both caused by and can only be resolved by networks of networks. He suggests that we need to develop a "new instinct" to help us understand the essence of this new era. Just as Nietzsche, at the turn of the last century, suggested that people needed a "sixth sense" to navigate the changes brought on by the Industrial Revolution, Ramo argues that we need a "seventh sense" to be able to make sense of this new age of constant connection. This seventh sense is what will enable us to look at things and see the ways in which they are being changed by connection.

Ramo suggest that developing this seventh sense involves acquiring an intuitive feel for how power is being regeared. He notes that a kid with a smartphone in our world has real strength, just as do stateless terrorists who are part of powerful networks. He points to the phenomenon of the Arab spring as example of this regearing of power. I would suggest that the surprising election results in Great Britain and in our own country are further evidence of how power is being regeared by connections. As Christians, we also need to look to the surprising emergence and reversals of power we find throughout the biblical narrative, especially in the work of the Holy Spirit.

Ramo cautions that the re-gearing of power is not just about decentralizing and reversals. Indeed a key to the seventh sense is recognizing the both and characteristic of power. In this new era power will not be either concentrated or distributed; it will be both concentrated and distributed. Recognizing the complex tensions and interactions of these patterns will require a significant shift in our mindset to the extent Ramos suggest that we will need "to rewire our minds".

As Christians developing a seventh sense will help us rediscover the power of the networks in our traditions and discover afresh how technological and other trends are transforming our world. Mechanical modes of thinking about leadership and institutions are fundamentally inadequate in an age of complexity and connections. We also need to rediscover what it means to cultivate innovation as an intrinsic part of our institution's and their roles in society. We need to practice traditional innovation and lean into both and patterns of thinking. In short we need to be more improvisational than we typically have been, holding together both centralized and decentralized approaches to power and relationships.

Our changing world and the need to develop a seventh sense provide marvelous opportunities for ministry. First, we can lift up how a connected world can further not erode the things that we care about most. Second, we can root the development of the seventh sense in an understanding of human nature that holds together both the best and worst of human capabilities. Third and perhaps most importantly, we can point to and model the centrality of trust and the virtues and practices that nurture trust in the functioning and interaction networks. Indeed the nature of our age requires nothing less of us as Christians.

I have rendered a judicious edition that includes the most famous of Gounod's great choruses: "Lovely Appear, Over the Mountains," "Unfold, Ye Portals Everlasting," and "O Divine Redeemer." Although most choirs have performed these as separate anthems, I don't believe this great oratorio has ever been performed in New Orleans. Gounod's lyrical melodies and rich accompaniments demonstrate his deep spiritual nature. Be sure to mark your calendars and invite your family and friends. Remember that the women will provide a scrumptious luncheon following the concert (10:30 a.m., Sunday, April 9).

We also remind singers that it is not too late to join the choir for this outstanding presentation. We often say the words: "Shout for Joy to the Lord." Join us as we turn the words into song: "Sing for Joy to the Lord." The great genius of the great composers needs expression in singing and playing their great works. Say it three times: Zimbelstern, Zimbelstern, Zimbelstern. What is it? Literally it means Star Bells. Our previous organ (the one that was destroyed by fire in 2000) had a stop called the Zimbelstern. So, what is it? It is a set of bells that are used to highlight the full organ sound. They are the "sprinkles" on top of the palate that is full organ. This stop is coming from Germany and will soon be installed. Watch for it (literally "listen for it").



Every year the Presbyterian Women of John Calvin Church select a worldwide mission to support. This year we have again selected Heifer International.

For more than 70 years Heifer International has partnered with and helped communities in 125 countries (including the USA) to attain sustainable livelihoods through community -owned interventions.

Heifer International empowers families to turn hunger and poverty into hope and prosperity....but their approach is more than just giving them a handout. Heifer links communities and helps bring sustainable agriculture and commerce to areas with a long history of poverty. The animals provide partners with both food and reliable income, as agricultural products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at market.

When many families gain this new sustainable income, it brings new opportunities for building schools, creating agricultural cooperatives, forming community savings and funding small businesses.
