## The Study Window

Defying Gravity Stewardship '18

#### From the Study Window

When we talk about stewardship sometimes it seems like God or the Church are after our money. Many of the stories in scripture particularly the stories of Joseph and the Good Samaritan make it clear that God wants something much more valuable, God wants us to be stewards who give ourselves completely to the work of the kingdom. The key to stewardship is to offer our lives to God with joy so that we can mature and be transformed over time. Financial gravity that pulls at all of our lives makes it seem like it is impossible to be generous and at the same time experience joy in living.

Tom Berlin, who developed the Defying Gravity stewardship campaign, uses the writings of Francis De Sales, a sixteenth century Catholic Priest to explain growth in grace and generosity. He points out that when grace first adorns our souls, we are like an ostrich. Ostriches can run, but they can't fly. When we experience the grace of God but don't have the devotion to respond by giving ourselves to God we can't fly and we end up simply asking for things from God.

The second stage of spiritual development occurs when a person begins to respond to God's grace through occasional acts of generosity. At this stage we are like chickens, we can fly but only in a very limited way. We can break free of gravity for only a short time before we go back to the ways of consumerism. As a result, our lives are spent focusing on earth rather than on God and God's grace.

De Sales suggests that devotion to God is the basis for and the key to generosity and joy in the Christian life. He suggests that people who give themselves to God, who put their lives in God's hands, learn to fly like the birds of the air. They take flight as naturally as eagles and soar to the heights of God's grace and love. The strength and joy in their lives comes from serving god with all they have and all their time talent and resources. Such people are generous because they are deeply grateful to god for the grace that sustains them. Deep gratitude to God lifts our focus to god and begins to enable us to see and respond to the situations and people around us as god does.

One of the main reasons people fail to move from ostrich to eagle is the increased devotion involved feels like sacrifice. When we look at things from the perspective of financial gravity, sacrifice is necessary. We are invited to give up some of our financial hopes and dreams, that we might generously help and serve others. The parable of the Good Samaritan makes clear what we are invited to do, so that we might soar as eagles. The man is beaten ,robbed and left on the side of the road. The Priest and the Levite pass by without helping the man. Then the Samaritan comes along, the last person that Jesus' audience would have expected to be the good guy. The Samaritan not only stops to check the man he bandages his wounds, he puts him on his own beast and takes him to the inn where he pays for the man's care and tells the innkeeper, if you spend more I will repay you. Jesus then says to his audience go and do likewise. When we accept Christ's invitation to generosity, and make the sacrifice involved, we find that our appreciation of God's love and grace more than compensates for any loss we experience.
