From the Study Window

Lent is a period of forty weekdays and six Sundays beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating in Holy Week. In joy and sorrow during this season the church proclaims, remembers, and responds to the atoning death of Christ. Each year during the Lenten season we, as a congregation, engage in bible study to more fully understand the grace that comes to us in Christ. This year our study will focus on "Recognizing God's Grace". The study guide we will use was put together by the Rev. Dr. Louis Weeks who has served as a missionary in the Presbyterian Church of the Congo, a professor at Louisville Presbyterian Seminary, and as President of Union Presbyterian Seminary in Richmond.

Presbyterians are people of faith who are seeking understanding. From our beginnings in the reformation we have realized that God calls us to explore ways the Christian faith can be more fully known and expressed. This vision has driven concerns for the education of people of all ages. Over the years we have been big on developing resources to help us delve more deeply in to the Christian faith and what it means for our lives today.

This "Recognizing God's Grace" study is one expression of the desire to open up what it means to be Presbyterian Christians in the world today. The purpose of the study is to enhance, enrich, and expand our insights. It will help us to grow in understanding of the elements that are foundational for our ongoing growth and development as Christians who live for and serve our Lord Jesus Christ. I invite you to join this journey of faith seeking understanding. I invite you to be stimulated and challenged by fresh insights that will deepen you understanding of God's presence in the world and in your life. I invite you to join this study and in the process find a stronger commitment to the God who came into the world as the babe in the manger; taught us what it means to live fully human lives, died on the cross for our sins, rose again and sits at the right hand of God where he makes intercession for us that we might grow into all that God intends us to be.

The schedule for our Lenten reflection and study is as follows:

March 1: Ash Wednesday Worship March 22: Reformed Understanding of Grace


March 8: The Bible Teaches about God's Grace March 29: Gracious Lives of Others

March 15: Grace through Christian History April 5: Practicing God's Grace


