

From the Pastor's Study

"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy".

(1 Peter 2:9-10)

To truly be a missional church we have to shift from on internal focus to an external focus. Reggie McNeil in his book <u>Missional Renaissance</u> declares that this means shifting our focus from a member culture to a missionary culture. A church that has a membership culture expects people to join the church and support it with the attendance, money, prayer and talent. The flow is toward the church which is always at the center of the action.

By way of contrast the missional church is made up of missionaries who are in the center of the action every day. The lives of people in a missional church are mission trips. On mission trips people focus on the work of God around them, alert to the Spirits' leading and serving people in tangible ways that often involve sacrifice and discomfort. While the concerns of life, family, work, leisure, etc. are pursued they are integrated into the larger story of being missionaries where they are.

A membership culture views society as a series of domains; things like business, art, healthcare, education, politics, etc. all of which are separate spheres. In this view the church is one domain positioned among the others vying for attention and money. The member culture church focuses all its efforts on the spiritual domain and thus misses the breadth of God's call.

The missional church views the church's position in society differently. It understands that God has His people, His missionaries, deployed across every domain of culture. Since the mission is redemptive and the world is God's target, it makes sense that God would use this approach. Such deployment is what God had in mind when he designated his people to be a kingdom of priests. This commission didn't anticipate a bunch of people tied up doing church work, insulated from the culture that needs to hear from God's priests. God had a mission in mind that everyone could participate in, and different than a member culture that gathers on Sunday to watch a few people exercise their gifts.

Moving from a member culture to a missionary culture means making heroes of Jesus followers who are using their life assignments as missionary posts to bless people. The idea is that in their daily life and routines, in their relationships and social networks, in their fields of influence, the people of God represent God to people and people to God. In a culture where many do not know the gospel this is essential work.

How many programs begin with a resurrection within the first twenty-two seconds? David T. Clydesdale begins his Easter Cantata, "The Victor," With Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. In this "film-scorish" masterpiece, we are guided through the final days of Jesus' earthly ministry by a man named Benjamin, played by Danny Cain. Benjamin (a fictitious character) is a Jewish religious leader, but curious and concerned about Jesus. "Could He possibly be the Messiah?"

The Chancel Choir, with soloists Sandy Cranfill, Sharon Fortin, Kelly Frost and guest tenor, David Bloom, dramatically present this very dramatic work. They will be assisted by members of the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra under the direction of William R. Memmott, Organist and Choir Director.

The program will also include the offertory anthem, "Jesus Christ, the Lord," by Jack Coleman and the unique settings (found in our hymnal) of the Gloria Patri and Doxology by Avery and Marsh. In keeping with the more contemporary style of the music for this day, Mr. Memmott has arranged for orchestra two works by the late organist/composer Richard Purvis: "Were You There?" (prelude) and "Kyrie Eleison" (postlude).

To conclude this festival day, the Presbyterian Women will be hosting the annual Palm Sunday Luncheon in Fellowship Hall.
