

Wednesday Night Live is a six session Bible Study that will take place on Wednesday evenings October 15-November 19. We will begin at 6 pm sharp and end promptly at 7pm. A light meal will be provided at 6PM. The study will be on discipleship and there will be a children/ youth component led by Laurie Robinson, our Christian Educator.

Our study comes from the <u>Being Reformed: Faith Seeking Understanding</u> series. Reformed and Presbyterian Christians are people of faith who are seeking understanding. From the beginning of our Reformed tradition, Presbyterians have realized God calls us to explore ways the Christian faith can be more fully known and expressed. Our purpose is to enhance, enrich and expand our insights into what it means to be disciples of our Lord Jesus Christ.

These studies engage our whole self. We find our minds moved by new ideas, our emotions stirred with responses of gratitude, and calls for action that can lead us in different directions. Heads, hearts, and hands will be drawn into the joys of discovering new dimensions of Discipleship: The Way of Jesus.



FROM THE STUDY WINDOW

For some time I have been talking with you about what it means to be a missional church. The first shift toward being a missional church is moving from an internal to an external focus. The second missional shift is about helping people grow into the human beings God intends them to be. Reggie McNeal points out that if we accomplish the first shift but not the second all we will succeed in doing is wearing ourselves out with extra activities. Our focus needs to be on developing people of faith rather than on developing programs.

For centuries church leaders told people how they should grow spiritually – attend services, discover their gifts, get involved in a small group, etc. and people did it for several reasons. One was a then prevailing world view that allowed for authoritative hierarchies. Another was a restriction of information so that spiritual insight was disproportionately owned by those with theological degrees and specialized training. All of this has changed. Just as people are taking greater roles in choosing their education pursuits, designing their work places, and managing their health care, they feel increasingly qualified to craft their own spiritual quests.

However the fact that people are no longer willing to let others, including and especially the church, script their spiritual journey doesn't mean that they are unwilling to be coached. People will accept help in shaping their spiritual path. In fact they welcome it from people they respect and trust who seem to have their best interests at heart.

What if we actually began to see ourselves as responsible for creating a culture where people get to participate in customizing their spiritual journeys based on their spiritual appetites and ambitions? All of us know the importance of a doctor or mechanic that listens to what we say and responds to our needs. Instead of simply creating programs and forcing people into that mold, we need to listen to people's problems, dreams, needs and receptivity and then work to shape an individualized path toward personal growth and maturity in faith.

Such an approach is very labor intensive. It is much harder to work with people on individual spiritual goals than it is to create a program and push people into it. But we don't have to abandon our programs to pursue engagement with people's spiritual journeys. We can use existing programs when crafting a portfolio of activities designed to accomplish each person's quest to grow in faith. It's a matter of perspective. In a program driven church you begin with programs and look for people to make them happen. In a people development church, you begin with people and use established programs and whatever else it takes to help them grow. What would it look like if we created online spiritual and life coaching, offering people suggestions of specific resources to consult and programs to participate in to specifically target specific spiritual objectives? Such efforts put programs in their proper place as a resource to help make people stronger Christians.
