Jesus Resurrection

The death and resurrection of Jesus were experienced by the early Christians as linked events. The Jesus who died for us was also raised for us. The message of the cross and resurrection formed the core of the early church's proclamation of Jesus. The resurrection is the guarantee that Christ's death is effective. Without the resurrection there would be no gospel to proclaim. As Paul points out to the Corinthians, without God's act of raising Jesus from the dead our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. The risen Christ is the assurance that believers one day will rise and that evil and death do not have the last word. It is God who gives the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. This victory is our future hope as well as a present reality in that the divine power of Christ's resurrection is experienced in the church and in the lives of Jesus followers.

From the Pastor's Study Continued ...

Jesus resurrection means that God vindicated Jesus. Easter is God's yes to the ministry of Jesus. In the resurrection, God reversed the injustice done to Jesus in this crucifixion and makes it clear that Jesus is the righteous one whose life, teaching, and death are now ratified by the power of God who raised him from the dead. The resurrection also marks God's exalting of Jesus so he is said to be raised to the right hand of God. As ancient kings in Israel were enthroned so now Jesus is exalted and raised up to share rule with God over the whole of creation.

Ultimately it is the resurrection of Jesus Christ that enables our redemption. Just as the fellowship between Jesus and his disciples is restored on that first Easter when Jesus appears to his followers, so now Jesus promises to restore fellowship and reconciliation to sinners. Indeed restored communion with Jesus is reconciliation with God in and through Jesus. Our justification, our being in right relationship with God, is made possible through Jesus death on the cross and God's raising Jesus to new life. As Paul wrote to the Romans, it will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead and who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification. Believers experience a real union with the living Christ and thus we are justified or saved.


The resurrection of Jesus Christ also reveals the future. Christ has set us free for the present evil age and inaugurated the age to come. The Jewish hope for a messianic age when God's reign will be complete has now been established in the raising of Jesus by God's power. The resurrection of Jesus is the pledge of future resurrection for all believers, the first fruits of those who have died. Through the resurrection believers have a hope of sharing the glory of God. If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his.

The resurrection of Jesus is central to the Christian faith. The Risen Christ makes all things new, for those who know the power of the resurrection, enabling us to serve Jesus Christ in the present as we look to the future with a living hope.
