# The Study Window

#### **First Things First**

In a clergy gathering a few months ago a fellow pastor told of a woman who came to him in his church and said, "Pastor I really love this time of year". "You mean the fall colors and the crisp autumn air", he replied. "No, that's not what I mean at all," she said. "I mean the stewardship campaign." He replied very honestly, "you've got to be kidding, you actually like this time of year?" "Yes, and I'll tell you why. This time of year makes me take stock of my life. It makes me think deeply about my priorities. It makes me ask if I am living the way God is calling me to live."

This is something that needs to happen at least once each year. We need to think deeply about our priorities. Am I living in accordance with the way of the kingdom? Stewardship season is a time to center ourselves anew upon God and the kingdom of God. Stewardship is about our faith long before it's about our money. It is not enough to just skim the surface and simply deciding to give what we gave last year. We need to prayerfully reflect on the richness of God's gifts to us and ask what, as your disciple, do you want me to give to support your work during the next year?

In Matthew 6 Jesus says to us, "do not worry about your life what you will eat or what you will drink or about your body as to what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing"? Then he invites us to look at the birds of the air how they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns yet God feeds them and they have enough. He asks rhetorically, "are you not of more value than they"? Then he invites us to consider the lilies of the field how they grow, they neither toil nor spin yet not even Solomon, one of Israel's greatest and richest kings, was not clothed like they are. He pointedly tells us that "if God so clothes the lilies of the field which are alive today and are thrown in the oven tomorrow will he not much more clothe you, you of little faith. Do not worry about these things your heavenly father knows that you need them. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well".

When Jesus says "strive first for the kingdom of God and all these things will be given to you as well"; what does he mean? He doesn't mean that our giving will guarantee that we get into heaven. Neither does he mean that we will have money dumped into our bank account. The prophet Malachi says that when we give, God will open the windows of heaven for us and pour down an overflowing blessing. And Jesus says that when we exercise a giving lifestyle we receive good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over. But neither promise has to do with winning some kind of divine lottery.

Rather if we give, there will be enough. If we are disciples in our giving, there will always be enough. No excess is promised, no fattened church coffers, no overflowing balances in the general fund but rather an abundance of enough. We will have enough for ourselves and enough for every good work.

### CHRISTIAN EDUCATION NEWS




