From the Study Window The Importance and Purpose of Lent

Lent is the span of time in the church calendar that begins with Ash Wednesday and ends with Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday commemorates the beginning of Jesus forty days of fasting and temptation in the wilderness and Easter Sunday commemorates Jesus resurrection following his death on the cross. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

Lent is not officially instituted in Scripture and thus it is not a requirement for Christians. But many denominations and individual Christians find the observance of the season an important way to grow in faith. Lent, is generally observed as a time for Christians to reflect, repent, and pray as a way of focusing their thoughts on Christ and all he has done for us in life, death, and resurrection.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting or self-denial and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection in which we reflect on the ways we fall short of what God calls us to be and prayerfully seek God's strength and guidance in growing into the disciples we are called to be. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, Christians focus on their relationship with God, engaging in prayers of confession and supplication, Bible study, and service in which they give themselves for others.

Our Lenten observances will begin with a light meal and an Ash Wednesday Worship service in the fellowship hall on February 10 at 6 pm. The worship service will begin at 6:30 and will be an invitation to the observance of the Lenten discipline in which we repent of our sin and turn toward God in prayer and reflection of scripture. The service will involve the imposition of ashes and will conclude with communion, which would be an invitation to live in justice, righteousness, and humility.


During the **Sundays** in Lent I will be focusing in the sermons on the words Christ spoken from the cross. At this point Jesus is well aware that he is dying and thus these are the last and some of the most important words of his communications to his followers. We will look at "Today you will be with me in paradise"; "Behold your son, behold your mother"; "my God, my God why have you forsaken me?" and "it is finished". We will also be continuing our journey to the cross and display of the various things involved in Christ's denial and crucifixion.

On **Wednesday evenings** we will continue our tradition of Wednesday Night Live with light meals and Bible Study. These will occur on Wednesdays, Feb. 17 through March 16. The study <u>Illuminating Lent</u> is written by Donald McKim, who is a retired Presbyterian minister who has served as editor for Westminster John Knox Press, a seminary theology professor and an academic dean as well as a pastor. The study will help us look at the Lord's Prayer in the context of Lent. The prayer gives us the foundation for faith and guides us into what our relationship with God in Jesus Christ can mean for us as disciples. In each session we will focus on a direction that the Lord's Prayer encourages us to look at in our spiritual growth and development.

I look forward to sharing with you in the Lenten Season and pray that it will be a time of enrichment in faith for all of us.

FROM THE MUSIC CORNER

Since Mardi Gras is early this year (February 9th), that means that Ash Wednesday and the Lenten Season are also early. Palm Sunday is March 20th when we shall present the Lenten Concert featuring the oratorio "Christus" by Felix Mendelssohn. So, we are busy in preparations.

When he was 9 years old his whole family became Christians which is reflected in his compositions. We are all familiar with his "Hark! the Herald Angels Sing," "A Midsummer Night's Dream Overture," and the Lone Ranger theme from the "Fingal's Cave Overture." When he was 20 a gift from his grandmother of the score of Bach's "St. Matthew Passion" led to a Bach revival across Europe.

A year before his death, Mendelssohn began work on "Christus," the life of Christ. Although not fully completed, his brother Paul published it from Felix's notes and manuscripts. It is replete with the rich melodic writing and dynamic accompaniments of this leading figure of the Romantic period. In the past we have performed the anthem from the work, "There Shall a Star from Jacob Rise Up." The entire work has not been done in New Orleans for many years.

Repeating our often sounded call for singers, now is a good time to join the choir. You will be blessed in your efforts and will contribute to our worship experience at JCPC: Wednesday nights at 7:15 p.m. Come and join us, and add March 20th to your calendar.


