

The Study Window





A third model draws upon military imagery. God and the devil are locked in combat over the destiny of humankind. In Christ's death on the cross, the devil appears to win but in the resurrection, Christ is victorious over the forces of evil. A financial model is also used to explain what God has done for us in Christ's life and death and resurrection. Our sin is a debt we cannot pay and as a result we are in a debtor's prison. We cannot pay our debt and can't be released until we do. Christ offers his life for us and pays the debt. Yet another model is the judicial model. God is the judge and human beings are the law breakers and the verdict is guilty and the sentence is death. But as a righteous person Christ stands in our defense and offers himself as a substitute for us and takes our punishment upon himself.

In classic reformed theology, unbelief is the root of sin and it follows that faith is the focus of Gods' saving activity. Faith is God's gift to us. For Calvin, faith is engendered in us by God's Word and Spirit and the Spirit works to renew our relationship to God. He insists that faith precedes repentance that repentance is in fact a consequence of faith. Because we have received the grace of God and the promise of salvation we are moved and enabled to repent. Salvation is not a matter of bringing external influences to bear in order to change God's mind about us. Faith is a firm and certain knowledge of God's benevolence toward us. This knowledge provides a confidence and security that frees us from living for ourselves. We no longer have to justify ourselves because we know we have been justified by God and rest secure in his grace and forgiveness.

Not only are we justified we are also sanctified. We experience a double grace of reconciliation and regeneration. In true repentance what happens is a mortification of the flesh, a dying to self and the receiving of the gift of New Life in which the Spirit restores the image of God that has been disfigured within us. Justification leads to the doing of good works.

Calvin did not see sanctification as a state of sinless perfection but a process in which our hearts, mind, and wills come more and more closely into agreement with God's will for our lives. In this sense salvation means not only that we will enter heaven when we die; it means that we are freed here and now in this life to live as who we are created to be. In God forgiveness, in being justified and sanctified, we are set free to live for God and others. Glory be to God for this incredible life changing gift.





FROM THE MUSIC CORNER

Palm Sunday, March 25, is early this year. Our featured Palm Sunday Concert will be "The Crucifixion" by Sir John Stainer (1840-1901). Written in 1887, "The Crucifixion" stands as the premiere Lenten cantata of the 19th century. Beginning as a chorister at St. Paul Cathedral in London, Stainer rose to become organist/choir master and a celebrated composer of his time.

No Lenten cantata has been performed as much as "The Crucifixion." It continues to be performed yearly by churches around the world. In the center of the work is his setting of "God so loved the world." It is sung unaccompanied. It is familiar to most church goers. The remainder of the work has traditionally been accompanied by piano or organ. In 2003 Craig Hawkins finally orchestrated the piece. We shall use his orchestration (a first for New Orleans)-with an ensemble from the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra.

Our own soloists will be singing: Sandy Cranfill - soprano; Sharon Fortin- soprano; Kelly Kron - alto; Ron Palmisano - bass; and guest David Bloom - tenor. Julie Etland on the keyboards and William R. Memmott conducting.

Lent has arrived and the children are learning so much in the lent classes on



START THE ADVENTURE IN READING





Every Monday and Wednesday during the school year, 5 second graders from Alice Birney Elementary School bounce into the John Calvin Fellowship Hall to work on their reading skills. After 5 minutes of outside play time and a healthy snack, the second graders and their volunteer tutors read...then read more...then keep reading.

STAIR (Start the Adventure in Reading) has been a fixture at John Calvin for the past ____ years. One-on-one attention from a volunteer tutor and lessons that are fun as well as fundamental have led "at risk" readers to find enjoyment in reading. Feedback from their teachers and parents, as well as improvement on standardized test, speak for the effectiveness of the program.

The John Calvin program is coordinated by Melinda Early and Richard Britson. John Calvin tutors include Sue Crawford, Sandy Cranfield, Jananne Lankard, and Linda Lowry. STAIR is just another example of how John Calvin Presbyterian Church is enriching the community.

Another good story...

The flowers in the sanctuary each Sunday are beautiful. Have you noticed? Each week there is a new arrangement of beautiful flowers: sometimes pastels, sometimes whites, sometimes bright, vivid colors, sometimes huge flowers, sometimes small flowers in groupings, but always beautiful and always something to enjoy.

Much of the time the flowers are taken by the family that donated them, but if the family doesn't take them, what happens to them? The Congregational Life Committee sponsors a team of people who take these flowers to people who may need something to brighten their lives. Each week a member of this team comes to the church to figure out what they might be able to do with the flowers. Sometimes the larger arrangements are broken up into smaller bunches to take to more than one person; sometimes the grouping is just so beautiful the whole thing is taken to one family.

Generally Rev. Harry and Eleanor are consulted as to who might have the greatest need for this little bit of cheering up. This is a wonderful ministry for someone relatively new to the congregation. They get to meet so many different people!

Recently, it was Ann Trapani's turn to take care of the flowers. Neither Rev. Harry nor Eleanor were available to help determine who might get them and Ann didn't know who to take them to that week. Who could use a bit of cheer? Did she know of anyone? What about the Independent Living facility that her dad stayed at? You remember Gunner Peterson, Ann's father? He had such wonderful stories about his life, and especially his experience in WWII, ready for anyone who would listen. He had lived at Nouveau Marc, in Kenner for 10 months prior to his passing in March of 2016. Ann hadn't been to visit the place since her dad's passing. Wouldn't it be a great place to take the flowers?

As Ann walked into the facility she was greeted by a host of familiar faces! A few remembered her and a few remembered her dad. Ann found a wonderful lady called "Miss Rose", whom she remembered visiting with often when visiting her father. Spending some time talking with Miss Rose, Ann learned that she had been living at Nouveau Marc for seven years after losing 2 children to cancer and her husband to a heart attack. She didn't have many visitors. What a blessing to have a familiar face take the time to listen for a bit! After leaving the flowers at the front desk for everyone to enjoy, and greeting another couple that remembered her dad, Ann escorted Miss Rose to the activity room for Bingo. What a joy to spend time with people from that generation.

What a wonderful day! It's funny how sometimes God leads you to those places you need to be.
