#### How do we get a new Pastor?



Do you get e-Mail? Do you use your computer to look up information or to purchase things? Or maybe you don't want to touch the thing! In any case, you certainly have heard how computers can be used to handle information: to sort it, to categorize it, to maybe send you an advertisement because of it!

What does this have to do with finding a new pastor? Interestingly enough, PC(USA) (Presbyterian Church in the USA) – This is the larger church organization we belong to) uses computers and information to help churches find the best fit for a new pastor. The system is called the "Church Leadership Connection" (CLC). Churches put their information into the CLC and prospective church workers put their information

in as well. The CLC then matches this information to find the best fit between churches and people seeking employment.

The CLC is used for all sorts of church workers: Solo Pastors, certainly, but Interim Pastors; Associate Pastors; Music Directors; Youth Directors; Administrators...there are 42 different types of jobs handled by the CLC. This is how we are getting the names of the people we are contacting to interview for our Interim Pastor position.

At the start, 9 people "self-referred" themselves based on the JCPC information. We are looking at the top 3 of these in detail. Just recently we requested that the CLC do a "match" between the information we put into the CLC and pastors seeking Interim positions. We received 25 new candidates! We have prioritized these and will begin interviewing as soon as feasible.

But where does the JCPC information come from? If the CLC is matching us to possible Interim Pastors, where does the information about JCPC come from? The first step the Interim Pastor Search Team took was to create this information about our church. Surprisingly, for the non-scientific method the Session used to create this team, we are a fairly good representation of John Calvin Church. We have new-ish members and long term members, women and men, youngish folks and older ones, as well as both conservatives and liberals. The information we put into the CLC is the opinion of these 7 people. But it is only these 7 people.

Once we have one the Interim Pastor, it will be the congregation's turn to do the work to create the JCPC information – to describing the kind of church we want to be – for all of us. The Interim Pastor will help us with that, challenging us on what we are truly willing to do to move into the future. This is the information that will go into the CLC system to match us with pastors seeking the same goals. Your participation in the work to discover who we are is imperative.

Just as you may select the color, style, and price of a new something "on line", the type, style, and energy of our new pastor will need your opinion – and this person will look at our information to help them select the type, style and energy of their new church!

Our energy, interest, and willingness to follow Christ will be matched to find the person the Lord intends for us and for whom we are intended!



As of this moment, we have completed three (3) of the four (4) weeks in June. We will be up again in November – which will be our third month (including January) of the year. The first three weeks of this month may have been the busiest three weeks we have experienced during the run of this program. Some recent developments in the benefits offered by our program may have been responsible for the noted uptick:

- -- The program has returned to making available <u>two</u> vouchers per person/month. A voucher provides one over-night stay, meals, and shower at the Salvation Army facility.
- -- Six (6) bus tokens are now available per month (2/week). (The increases in available vouchers and bus tokens are the result of accumulated special donations.)
- -- NEW The program is now providing "breakfast" (a high protein snack) when folks first arrive (along with the traditional coffee). As example, John Calvin provided "string cheese" (6 grams of protein) during this month.
  - -- <u>Continuing</u>: Student social workers are available on site; A Health Dept. mobile unit is available several times a month to do screenings, such as those for AIDS and TB; Of course, lunches, toiletries, and clothing continue to be provided.
  - -- NEW Soon, several computers will be available on site for the limited use of those whom we serve. St. Charles Presbyterian has been instrumental in the funding of this new service.

The foundation of the Program of Hope is its volunteers – all of whom have been so loyal to this program, year after year – THANK YOU: Margaret Corcoran, Carol Formaux, Lorraine Hicks, Sue Crawford, Barbara McHan, Jananne Lankard, Barbara Remmelts, Barbara Eagan, Barbara Taylor, Sharon Fortin, Linda Lowry, Amy Cardinale, and Richard Britson.
