From Reverend Ochart

It is February in New Orleans, and even though this year is different from years past, there is still a festive mood in the air. King Cakes are everywhere (including our pantry), decorations cover houses (with some very impressive "Yardi Gras" House Floats unique to this year), and everywhere the gold, purple, and green of the season can be seen.

You certainly know this better than I, but I will remind us all nonetheless of the liturgical history of this season. Mardi Gras, or "Fat Tuesday" began as a celebration on the day(s) before Ash Wednesday, the official start to the season of Lent. The name came as a result of the practice in Roman Catholic traditions (specifically in French and Spanish communities) of a feast to eat all of the meat before refraining from it during Lent as an act of sacrifice. In some communities, this celebration began to extend beyond the one day of Tuesday, and locally now takes up the season from Epiphany to Lent. While in some quarters, the celebration of Mardi Gras has taken on a 'Sin as much as you can before Lent' kind of vibe, in most places it is a celebration of life which is a perfect and logical precursor to Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday traditionally begins the season of Lent with the Imposition of Ashes (which is where it gets its name). This is the act of having our foreheads marked with ash in the sign of a cross and the words, "You are dust, and to dust you will return." It is a reminder of our own mortality and need for repentance (even if we didn't do anything that bad during Mardi Gras). In the midst of a global pandemic, we may not need as much of a reminder of our mortality as other years, but the reminder that we are marked by God, is just as important for us to hear right now (if not more). This year, Ash Wednesday is February 17th, and our service will be at 6 pm.

Lent is the season of preparation before Holy Week and Easter Sunday. From the earliest days of the church, this season was set aside to provide all believers (but especially new converts or those being reintegrated into the church) a time of prayerful and penitent reflection on their own sinfulness. In many Christian communities, notably our siblings in the Roman Catholic tradition, Lent is a season of abstention and fasting. More recently, Lent has become a season to add acts of service or take on acts of spiritual discipline. This year, Julie will reprise her Lenten Bible Study on 'Wilderness' which I hope you will join us for.

Consider how you are being called to prepare during the season of Lent. Do you need to eliminate something from your life? Do you need to take something up? As a possible option, The Synod of the Sun's <u>Network for Dismantling Racism</u> has posted a calendar of activities for understanding and thinking through issues of systemic racism during the season of Lent.
